Young Investigator Award in Pediatric Hematology/Oncology

The ASPH/O Young Investigator Award was established in 1989 to formally recognize excellence in research in pediatric hematology and oncology. The qualifications for award candidates are as follows:

- ❖ Less than 4 years have elapsed since the completion of the standard 3-year pediatric hematology/oncology fellowship
- ❖ The candidate has conducted high-quality clinical or laboratory research on a project for which he or she participated actively in the design, conduct, and data analysis
- ❖ The candidate is committed to a career that includes clinical and/or laboratory investigation in pediatric hematology/oncology

To apply, please include the following

- ❖ An abstract with the young investigator designated as the first author
- ❖ The candidate's curriculum vitae
- ❖ A one-page statement of career goals
- ❖ A supporting letter from the training program director or clinical/laboratory mentor attesting to the fact that the nominee has played a major if not the key role in the conduct of the research project and confirming the candidate's promise as a young investigator in pediatric hematology/oncology

Winners are chosen by evaluation of abstracts submitted for presentation at the annual meeting of ASPH/O, together with review of each candidate's other research contributions. The award consists of \$1,000 and a certificate.
