Society for Pediatric Research Award Criteria

To Apply for an Award:

- ❖ Carefully review the criteria below for each of the awards to determine eligibility.
- ❖ If you wish to be considered for one or more of these awards, you MUST indicate your interest by checking the special box on the abstract submission form.
- ❖ Complete the Appropriate Award Application Form(s). One application form/packet must be provided for each award for which you wish to be considered.
- ❖ Include all of the required supplemental materials to make your Award Application complete.

Information About Awards:

- ❖ Only abstracts accepted for presentation will be considered.
- ❖ Each of these awards will be presented during the PAS Annual Meeting in Baltimore

Richard D. Rowe Award in Perinatal Cardiology

The Richard D. Rowe Award in Perinatal Cardiology was established in 1989 by colleagues, trainees, and friends of Dr. Rowe to honor his many personal achievements, commitment to academic excellence, integrity and humility. The winning candidate is selected by a committee from the Society for Pediatric Research on the basis of both the quality of the work presented in the abstract and the information contained in the sponsoring letter. The award carries a monetary prize of \$1,000.

Candidates must fulfill the following conditions:

- ◆ A completed application form.
- ◆ Have MD, PhD, or equivalent degree and be within 3 years of completion of post-doctoral education (individuals who are in the process of obtaining such an education but have already completed original work are encouraged to apply).
- ◆ First authorship on an abstract submitted to the PAS Annual Meeting.
- ◆ The appropriate box on the abstract form must be checked.
- ◆ A sponsoring letter from a member of the SPR. This letter should contain a short appraisal of the candidate's accomplishments and potential and clearly outline his/her participation in the work contained in the abstract.
- ◆ A copy of the candidate's curriculum vitae.
- ◆ The abstracts must be accepted for presentation at the PAS Annual Meeting to be considered.
- ◆ The nominee must present the study at the annual meeting.

David G. Nathan Award in Hematology/Oncology

The David G. Nathan Award in Hematology/Oncology was established in 2000 by the colleagues, trainees, and friends of Dr. Nathan to honor his achievements in every aspect of academic pediatrics. The winning candidate is selected by a committee from the Society for Pediatric Research on the quality of the work presented in the abstract. The award carries a monetary prize of \$1,000.

Candidates must fulfill the following conditions:

- ◆ A completed application form.
- ◆ First authorship on an abstract submitted to the PAS Annual Meeting in the field of pediatric hematology/oncology.
- ◆ Must be submitted prior to the completion of fellowship.
- ◆ The appropriate box on the 2002 PAS Abstract Form must be checked for the David G. Nathan Award.
- ◆ A letter from the senior investigator or sponsor that includes a statement that the work was performed by the nominee and fully addresses the role the candidate had in the work.
- ◆ The abstract must be accepted for presentation at the PAS annual meeting to be considered.
- ◆ The nominee must present the study at the annual meeting.

Fellow Research Awards (Basic and Clinical)

The Society for Pediatric Research annually honors students, house officers and fellows engaged in pediatric research. These awards are designed to encourage pediatricians in training to pursue careers in academic pediatrics. Winning candidates are selected by a committee from the Society for Pediatric Research based on the quality of the work presented in the abstract. Each award (\$1,000) is given annual to one to three individuals in each category at the PAS Annual Meeting.

Candidates must fulfill the following conditions:

- ◆ A completed application form.
- ◆ First authorship on an abstract submitted to the PAS Annual Meeting.
- ◆ The appropriate box on the abstract form must be checked.
- ◆ A letter from the senior investigator or sponsor that includes a statement that the work was performed by the nominee and fully addresses the role the candidate had in the work and why the caliber of this study is worthy of a national award.
- ◆ The abstracts must be accepted for presentation at the PAS Annual Meeting to be considered.
- ◆ The nominee must present the study at the annual meeting.

Travel Grants—New for 2002

The Society for Pediatric Research and American Pediatric Society will award travel grants in the amount of \$500 plus complimentary meeting registration to attend the PAS Annual Meeting. Travel grants are possible to **at least four runner-ups** among the House Officer and Fellow Basic and Clinical Award categories. Travel grants will be awarded during the SPR Presidential Plenary in Baltimore, Maryland.
