The primary purpose of the Society for Pediatric Research (SPR) is to encourage pediatric investigation by providing a forum for the presentation and dissemination of innovative ideas and research that advance the causes of pediatric medicine and the health and well-being of children. The SPR has revised eligibility criteria for membership and now welcomes applicants from all nations. Prospective members must have an advanced degree (beyond a Bachelor's degree, may include but not limited to M.D., Ph.D., D.O., Pharm.D., MPH, and MA/MS). Candidates should be actively engaged in clinical or laboratory investigation that is relevant to pediatrics and should be less than 46 years of age at the time of application. Prospective members may be 46 years or older if their research training was prolonged, interrupted, or attained in mid-career or if his/her research career was interrupted for two or more years.
