1125 Translating Research into Pediatric Clinical Practice Topic Symposium ~ Vancouver Convention Centre

Target Audience: Clinicians, health services researchers, public health involved with implementing evidence-driven care. Appeal will be practitioners and managers who are coming under increased pressure by accreditors, board certifiers, and payers, many of whom have initiated performance measurement and pay-for-performance programs, to implement evidence-based care as well as researchers looking to partner with practice settings and health plans. This topic symposium capitalizes on this confluence of research, practice, and policy dynamics to review current federal efforts to promote community engagement in research; examine models of research dissemination and implementation; identify existing practice networks; and identify future collaborative directions.

Objectives:

- To understand the NIH's current efforts to focus on the translation of research into practice, including comparative effectiveness research,

- To provide an overview of models of disseminating and implementing research in inpatient and outpatient pediatric settings, and
- To identify possible mechanisms for future collaborations between researchers and practice settings

The National Institutes of Health Clinical and Translational Science Award (CTSA) Program was developed to speed the time between new discoveries in the laboratory and improvement care and health outcomes. This is a tremendous opportunity to fill in important gaps regarding the effectiveness of drugs and devices in children and to improve the quality of care that children receive in inpatient and outpatient settings across the range of services from primary to specialty care. In this session we will provide an overview of the CTSA strategic vision (including comparative effectiveness research), highlight several examples of pediatric research-practitioner collaborations in the inpatient and outpatient settings, and provide practical recommendations about how to develop partnerships with clinical research networks to conduct translational research on pediatric strategic priorities, with the goal of engaging stakeholders in this change process.
