Exhibitor Badges

Exhibitors are encouraged to register in advance. There is NO CHARGE for the registration of exhibitor representatives up to 15 per 100 sq ft. Additional representatives may be registered for a fee of \$75 each. A registration form will be included in your Exhibitor Service Manual.

Representatives registered through Exhibitor Registration will be provided with an exhibitor badge only. Any representative desiring an attendee badge will be required to pay a full PAS meeting registration fee (no exceptions).

Exhibitor badges are personal and non-transferable. Each representative of an exhibiting company must wear the official badge at all times while in the exhibit area. Supplementing this identification with business cards, ribbons, or company logotypes is not permitted. Exhibitor badges may be made out only in the name of the company shown on the Space Application. False certification of individuals as exhibitor representatives, misuse of exhibitor badges, or any other method or device used to assist unauthorized persons to gain admission to the exhibit floor is in strict violation of the PAS rules and regulations.

Personal Unloading/Reloading of Exhibits

All exhibit materials being personally delivered by vehicle to the Baltimore Convention Center must be unloaded/reloaded at the loading dock. Exhibitors using loading docks must unload their vehicles promptly, and then deliver their materials to the booth area using designated elevators and entrances.

The PAS reserves the right to order labor to set up any exhibit with large crates that is not in the process of being erected by 3:30pm on Saturday, April 28. The exhibitor is liable for this labor. All exhibit installation, including product literature and displays must be completed by 3:30pm on Saturday, April 28.

Dismantling

Tuesday, May 1 - 1:00pm - 6:00pm
Wednesday, May 2 - 7:00am - 1:00pm

Dismantling or packaging can begin only after the close of the Technical Exhibition. Any infraction of the dismantling and packaging regulations will result in the automatic forfeiture of 50% of the exhibitor's total accumulated priority points for the PAS. For a full explanation of the early dismantling policy, please see the section on "Violations" (page 15). All exhibits must be removed from the Baltimore Convention Center by 1:00pm on Wednesday, May 2.

Security

The PAS will provide around-the-clock security to control access to the exhibit hall beginning at 1:00pm on April 26, and continuing until 2:00pm on Wednesday, May 2. However, the Pediatric Academic Societies and the Baltimore Convention Center are not responsible for loss of or damage to exhibitor property. Exhibitors are urged to exercise normal precautions to discourage theft.

Union Regulations

Exhibit installation/dismantling union jurisdictions prevail over all setup and dismantling of exhibits, including signs and laying of carpet. This does not apply to the unpacking and placement of your merchandise. You may set up your own display if you use company personnel. Do not attempt to bring in "pick-up" labor; comply with local and state fire, safety, and insurance regulations and rules set by exposition management. Unions claim jurisdiction under all other circumstances.

Material Handling/Storage/Hauling

Union jurisdictions prevail over the operation of all material handling equipment, all unloading and reloading, and all handling of empty containers. An exhibitor may move material that can be hand carried or moved by a two-wheel dolly through the designated dock entrance and freight elevators. Unions claim jurisdiction under all other circumstances.

The official material handling contractor will move all freight from the docks to the exhibitor's booth. This service includes:

- Storage prior to the show (30 days)
- Transportation from warehouse to booth
- Storage of empty crates
- Reloading at show site
- Clerical assistance and delivery to a common carrier at the loading dock at the close of show.

Tipping

Champion Exposition Services requests that exhibitors not tip their employees. They are paid excellent wages, and feel that tipping is not necessary. This applies to all Champion employees and subcontractor employees.

Eligibility to Exhibit

The Technical Exhibition is an extension of the continuing medical education program of the PAS. In order for your application to be accepted, your products and services must be related to the practice of pediatrics, and you must be in good financial standing with the PAS. All confirmed exhibitors will be required to complete the official Letter of Agreement supplied by the CME sponsor prior to show opening.

The PAS has the right to withhold approval of the exhibition of products and services that, in its judgement, do not further the education, scientific, or practice needs of our members and attendees. At the request of the PAS, an exhibitor shall remove any product or service included in the display for which approval has not been given.

Contract for Space

The information contained in this *Invitation to Exhibit*, the *Exhibit Space Contract*, and the *Formal Notice of Assignment* constitute a contract for the right to use the space allocated. The *Exhibit Space Contract* can be found in the back pocket of this prospectus.

Space Assignments

All applicants for exhibit space are required to complete the *Exhibit Space Contract* and submit it to the PAS Program Office.

Booth space will be assigned by the point system and will be determined in the following order:

- Total accumulation of points
- Total number of years exhibited with PAS (5 points per year)
- Total number of booths accumulated throughout the past years (3 points per booth)
- Consecutive years exhibited with PAS (1 point per 3 consecutive years)
- Date contract received in the PAS Exposition Office

**Booth Assignments will begin
December 4, 2000**

- Reservations of booth space will NOT be accepted over the telephone or fax.
- All booths are shown on the floor plan.
- Management reserves the right to revise the floor plan if necessary.

Exhibit Booth Specifications

Booth space that is not confined to a perimeter wall must NOT exceed a height of 18 feet (with special approval). No obstructions in the front half of the booth above a height of 40 inches is permitted.

Exhibit Booth Fee

The standard booth size is 10'x10' or multiples thereof. Island Booths are multiples of 10'x10's. Following is the fee structure for exhibit booths:

Non-Profit Exhibit Space

This space is limited to non-profit organizations per the IRS Tax Code 501(c)3

The non-profit rate is for 501(c)3 organizations only and non-profit certificate must accompany payment and contract. Non-profit companies that hire for-profit companies to exhibit on their behalf (i.e. market research and recruitment) will not qualify for the non-profit rate.

Booth Assignment and Fees

Terms of Payment

A deposit of 25% (\$550 per 10x10) of total exhibit space cost must accompany the *Exhibit Space Contract*. Applications will not be processed nor space assigned without required deposit. The final 75% is due no later than January 31, 2001.

If full payment is not received within this time period, assigned space may be reassigned or sold.

FULL payment for exhibit space must accompany any application received after January 31, 2001.

Exhibitors will not be allowed to occupy assigned space until all monies due the Associations are paid in full and the Letter of Agreement is submitted.

Cancellation of Space

For cancellations more than 90 days prior to opening day (January 28th), 25% of total booth rental fee will be retained by the Associations. If cancellation is less than 90 days and space is not resold or exposition is not sold out, 100% will be retained by the Associations.

If exposition is sold out, 25% will be retained by the Associations.

Island Booth

Island booths will not be equipped with drape. The height restriction of the island booths will be 18 feet. Island booths may occupy 100% of the rental space, but **must** maintain a 50% see-through effect on that portion of the booth up to 8 feet. A sketch of the island booths must be submitted to the Official Decorator and/or the Baltimore Convention Center at their request. If sketches are not submitted and the construction is determined to be in violation of the above restrictions, the Associations have the right to prohibit the assembling of the booth. Due to the unique design of the Baltimore Convention Center, ceiling heights vary in certain areas of the halls. See *Floor Plan* for specifics.

PAS Show Management reserves the right to request the Service Contractor to begin set up on any booth that has not begun construction/ set-up by 3:30pm, April 28th, at the exhibiting

company's expense. There will be no exceptions to this rule. Invoices for labor and materials will be billed directly to the exhibiting company.

Exhibitor Listing

All exhibitors will be listed, alphabetically, in the Official On-Site Program. Exhibitors will also be listed, alphabetically, with booth number, city/state, and a brief description of their products/services in the official program. In order to be included in this listing, please complete the *Product Description* form included with this *Invitation to Exhibit*. The cutoff date for receipt of this form is February 16, 2000. If this description is not provided, **ONLY** the name of the exhibiting company and the booth number will appear.

FDA Regulations

Exhibitors are reminded of the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) restrictions on the promotion of investigational and pre-approved drugs and devices. Exhibitors are also cautioned about FDA prohibition of promoting approved drugs for unapproved purposes. Information regarding FDA regulations may be obtained directly from the FDA.

Booth Signage

A two-line 7" x 44" identification sign in show colors of black, white and teal, will be provided giving the exhibitor's name and booth number.

Standard Booth

All linear booths are 100 sq ft (10'x10') unless otherwise noted. Booths have a back wall drape that is 8' high, with sidewall drapes that are 36" high.

Total height of exhibits (including decorations) may not exceed 8'3" in height. All display fixtures more than 4' in height and placed within 10 lineal feet of an adjoining exhibit must be confined to that area of the exhibitor's space that is at least 5' from the aisle line.

Peninsula Booth

A peninsula booth is a grouping of 10'x10' booths with aisles on three sides. The back wall of a peninsula booth must be on the non-aisle and must not exceed the 8'3" height limitation. The back wall shall be centered on and not exceed in width one half the dimension of one side of a sidewall. The remainder of the back wall shall not exceed 4' in height.

Island Booth

An island exhibit is a display in four or more standard units with aisles on all four sides. Full use of the space is permitted, but the design of the booth must allow for see-through visibility and accessibility from all four aisles. Island booths are shown on the enclosed *Floor Plan*. Additional islands may be made by selecting any full block of numbered booths.

No drapery is provided for island booths. Island booth displays (including decorations) may not exceed 18' in height.

Hanging Signs

Hanging signs are not permitted at the PAS Exhibition.

Facility Information

The Baltimore Convention Center has been designed to meet all power needs and service requirements of exhibitors. These requirements include:

- Hall Clearances
 - Max Ceiling Height 30' at center
 - Swing Hall Height 13 - 30'
 - (See *Floor Plan* for specifics)
- 120/208V and 277/480V Electrical w/ approx. 30 foot spacing on the floor
- Direct drive-in access for vehicles through 15' x 18' overhead doors

Americans With Disabilities Act

Each exhibitor shall be responsible for compliance with the Americans With Disabilities Act within its booth and assigned exhibit space.

General Information

Exposed unfinished sides or exhibit backgrounds must be draped to present an attractive appearance. Close off drapery will be provided at no charge to the exhibitor

Booth carpeting is mandatory and is the responsibility of the exhibiting company.

The exhibits will be inspected at 1:00pm on Saturday, April 28. At this time the decorator, with the approval of the Exhibit Manager, will provide draping and booth carpeting as deemed necessary. Any charges incurred will be the responsibility of the exhibitor.

Booth cleaning is mandatory after move-in and is not included in the exhibit rental fee. The PAS has the right to order cleaning if booth appearance is unsightly. Cost will be charged to the exhibiting company.

Electrical requirements, projection requirements, and all furniture and accessories are the responsibility of the exhibiting company. Order forms for the above services and equipment will be included in the Exhibitor Service Manual which will be mailed to exhibitors in February, 2001.

General

The Pediatric Academic Societies (PAS) acts for exhibitors and their representatives in the capacity of agent, not as principal. The PAS assumes no liability for any act of omission or commission in connection with this agency, including, but not limited to any loss or damages suffered by an exhibitor as a result of any act or omission of any vendor, service providers, or other exhibitors. Exhibitors and their representatives hereby release the PAS from any and all liabilities for loss or damage ensuing from any cause whatsoever, except for claims for damages or injuries resulting from the PAS failure to fulfill its obligations as set forth in this Prospectus.

Before any exhibit may be removed from the building, exhibitors must make arrangements satisfactory to the PAS, the Baltimore Convention Center, and the PAS official vendors for the payment of any charges incurred by the exhibitor in connection with presenting their exhibit.

Liability

The exhibitor agrees to protect and keep the PAS forever harmless from any damage or charges imposed for any violation of any law or ordinance whether occasioned by the negligence of the exhibitor or those holding under the exhibitor, as well as to strictly comply with the applicable terms and conditions contained in the agreement between the exhibit hall and the PAS regarding the exhibit premises; and further, the exhibitor shall at all times protect, indemnify and keep harmless the PAS and the Baltimore Convention Center against and for any and all costs,

damages, liability, or expense arising from or out of accident or other occurrence to anyone, including the exhibitor, its agents, employees or business invitee, which arise from or out of or by reason of said exhibitor occupancy and use of the exhibition premises or a part thereof. Exhibitors are encouraged to insure themselves against property loss or damage and against liability for personal injury.

Conditions of Contract to Exhibit

Exhibitors agree to abide by the conditions of contract published in this Prospectus and by all conditions under which space at the Baltimore Convention Center is leased to the PAS. Exhibitors accept responsibility for informing all of their employees and agents of these conditions and agree that they will abide by them also.

Violations

As a condition for exhibiting, each exhibitor shall agree that they, their employees, and their agents will observe all PAS policies and regulations as described in this Prospectus.

Failure to halt or amend these actions or comply with these policy and/or regulations will result in the following penalties:

- A warning will be issued to the exhibiting company, outlining the actions which are in violation of the policy and regulations.
- The first penalty assessed by the PAS will result in the company not accruing the exhibit participation points for the current year.
- The second penalty assessed by the PAS will result in the company losing one-half of its accrued exhibit participation points.
- The third penalty assessed by the PAS will result in the company losing all of its accrued exhibit participation points.
- The fourth penalty assessed by the PAS will result in the company not being eligible to exhibit at future PAS meetings and exhibitions.

The PAS reserves the right to restrict and/or dismiss at any time any exhibit which it deems undesirable.

Violators of rules and regulations outlined in this Prospectus will incur a reduction in points as outlined above for each penalty assessed.

Any exhibitor who begins dismantling or packaging their exhibit and/or exhibit materials prior to the close of technical exhibits, will automatically forfeit all priority points earned over the past five (5) years and may not be permitted to participate in future PAS exhibitions.

Whenever practical or appropriate in the view of the PAS, disciplinary action will be progressive, according to the above sequence. However, the PAS reserves the right to levy a more severe penalty, including refusal of or termination of the exhibit at our discretion, without progressing through each of the above successive steps. In the event of such restriction or eviction, the PAS will not be liable for any refunds or rentals, or other exhibit expenses.

In all interpretations of the rules and regulations, the decision of the PAS is final.

Any objectionable practices by exhibitors or official suppliers should be reported to the PAS Exposition Manager immediately.

Cancellation of Exposition

In the event of cancellation of the PAS Exposition due to fire, strikes, governmental regulations, or causes which would prevent the scheduled opening or continuance, then and there upon exhibitors and the PAS have no further obligations to each other, and the PAS management shall determine an equitable basis for the refund of such portion of exhibit fees as is possible, after due consideration of expenditures and commitments already made.

Security

General overall 24-hour guard service will be provided by the PAS for the convention period from the beginning of move-in to the end of move-out. The Associations, however, will not be held responsible for the loss of any material

for any cause and urges the exhibitor to exercise normal precautions to discourage loss due to theft or any other cause.

Fire and Safety Regulations

Federal, state, and city fire laws must be strictly observed. Complete fire safety requirements from the Convention Center will be included in your Exhibitor Service Manual.

Hazardous Waste Disposal

Hazardous waste is any material being stored, recycled, or thrown away that could cause injury or death, or pollute air, land, or water. At the time of space application, exhibitors who generate material fitting any of these criteria should inform the Exhibit Manager of the presence and planned disposition of hazardous waste to allow for thorough planning and preparation.

Independent Contractor

Exhibitors who plan to use the service of anyone other than the official service contractor (independent contractors) must notify the PAS Exposition Office and Champion Exposition Services, and send a certificate of insurance no less than 30 days prior to the show. Independent contractors must abide by all rules and regulations set forth by the PAS and the Baltimore Convention Center.

Independent contractors must:

- Perform all services in a professional manner in accordance with the exhibition Rules and Regulations.
- Not engage in solicitation of business on the exhibit floor for present or future conventions.
- Confine operation to the exhibit area of their client(s), or in areas specifically designated by the PAS. The exhibit floor, aisles, loading docks, and service/storage areas will be under the control of the official service contractor. The exhibitor-appointed contractor must coordinate all activities with the official service contractor.
- Provide an original Certificate of Insurance to the Exhibit Manager 30 days prior to the show dates. The insurance certificate must prove the policy will be in effect during the installation and dismantling dates. Comprehensive general liability insurance against claims for bodily injury or death and property damage of not less than \$1 million for each occurrence and an active workers' compensation insurance policy covering all permanent employees and temporary labor hired to perform work on this event are required. The certificate must name the Pediatric Academic Societies as certificate holders and as additional insured.
- Order decorator labor in advance, either with the official service contractor, or directly from the union.
- Upon arrival, check in at the Champion Service Desk to obtain work badges to enable personnel to work on the exhibit floor.

Selling of Products and Services

The purpose of the exhibits is to further the education of meeting attendees through product and service displays and demonstrations. Sales and order taking are permitted provided all transactions are conducted in a manner consistent with the professional nature of the meeting. No signage or advertising of products pricing will be allowed. PRODUCTS FOR SALE MUST BE THE EXHIBITOR'S OWN UNALTERED, MARKETED PRODUCTS, AND THE PRODUCTS OR SERVICES MUST BE PERTINENT TO THE ATTENDEES' PROFESSIONAL INTEREST. PAS reserves the right to restrict sales activities that it deems inappropriate or unprofessional.

Distribution of Printed Materials and Canvassing by Industry

Canvassing in any part of the facilities utilized by PAS is strictly forbidden, and anyone doing so will be requested to leave the building. Distribution of advertising or printed material by the exhibitor outside of the exhibitor's allotted space will not be permitted unless the distribution or advertising is organized by the PAS.

Booth Activity

Entertainment/Promotional Activity

Demonstrations or live interviews must be confined to the limits of the space contracted.

The use of magicians, fortune tellers, dancers, mimes, puppet shows, or other entertainment of this nature is prohibited unless exhibitor has written permission from the PAS. The use of celebrities who are not routinely employed as spokespersons for the exhibiting company is discouraged. Special promotional activities must have written permission and must be contained within the space contracted.

Educational Events in Exhibit Booths

Exhibiting companies must inform PAS, in writing, of all educational events offered in their exhibit booths. Notification letters must include a description of the event identifying format, content, date, time, and names of physicians involved in delivery of the educational event.

Following are guidelines for educational events in exhibit booths:

- Signage in booths must include the following wording: "This event is not a part of the official PAS program and is not approved for Category 1 CME credit."
- Companies are advised to reference FDA guidelines
- No formal seating is allowed in exhibit booths for these events.

Sound and Audiovisual

Audiovisual and other sound effects must be regulated so that they do not disturb neighboring exhibits. The Exhibit Manager reserves the right to determine at what point sound interferes with others and must be discontinued.

Photography

An exhibit booth may not be photographed or videotaped without the permission of the legitimate occupants of that booth. This prohibition extends to the members of the medical or lay press. Booth personnel should notify the Exhibit Manager if they are being photographed/videotaped without their permission.

Giveaways

Novelty gifts or souvenirs not manufactured by the exhibiting company must be submitted to the PAS for review. These premiums should be items that can be used during the meeting or in the professional activities of the attendee. The Notification of Intent to Distribute Premium or Novelty items form will be included in your Exhibitor Service Manual and must be returned to Kathy Cannon at the PAS Program Office for approval.

The PAS may withhold or withdraw permission to distribute souvenirs, advertising, or other material it considered objectionable. Exhibitors may not distribute stick-on emblems, unofficial badges or company nameplates.

No balloons may be used as booth decoration or inflated to distribute to visitors at a booth.

Prizes, sponsored contests, or drawings are not permitted during the meeting.

Promotion of sponsored drawings after the meeting are not allowed in the exhibit hall or in any part of the facilities utilized by PAS.

Registration of Exhibit Builders and Specialty Contractors

So that insurance coverage can be verified and access to the exhibit hall authorized, exhibitors must notify the PAS if a contractor not included in the Exhibitor Service Manual will be servicing the exhibit. This includes exhibit designers and builders, audiovisual and computer suppliers, florists, security firms, photographers, etc. All rules and deadlines contained under "Independent Contractor" apply (pg 16).

The PAS will work only with the exhibiting company, as the contract for exhibit space is between PAS and the exhibiting company. Communication with non-official or exhibitor-appointed contractors is the responsibility of the exhibiting company.

Display Regulations

Music

Live performance of music is not permitted. License agreements for music covered by ASCAP, BMI, and other organizations are the sole responsibility of the exhibitor.

Market Research

Market research companies will be assigned space ONLY if space is available, and if research is being done for an approved exhibitor. Research companies MUST submit an application for space and abide by the following regulations:

- Booths must be kept open and staffed daily during all exhibit hours by your company's staff. Breaking down or packaging up materials earlier than 1:00pm Tuesday, May 1 is prohibited (see "Violations" on page 15).
- Market research companies must submit a letter of authorization from the client for whom they are conducting research with the application for space.
- Surveys and questionnaires must be submitted for approval to the Exhibit Manager by April 27th.
- All surveys must be conducted within the confines of the booth(s) assigned. At no times should exhibit personnel leave their booth(s) to encourage attendees in the aisles to return with them to their booth(s). Surveys and questionnaires must not be administered in the aisles. This regulation applies equally to all exhibitors; all business must be conducted within the confines of the booth(s) assigned.
- Survey documents must not include the name of the Pediatric Academic Societies, or make any reference to this meeting that might cause respondents to believe that the PAS is sponsoring the research.

Notice to Exhibitors

1. Decorations, signs, banners, etc., may not be taped, nailed, tacked, stapled, or otherwise fastened to ceilings, walls, painted surfaces, or columns. PAS Exhibitors are not allowed to hang signs or banners from the ceiling of the Convention Center.
2. No holes may be drilled, cored, or punched in the facility.
3. No adhesive backed (stick-on) decals or similar items may be distributed or used in the facility.
4. No sample food and/or beverage products may be distributed by exposition sponsoring organizations and/or exhibitors EXCEPT UPON WRITTEN AUTHORIZATION of the Baltimore Convention Center's exclusive catering contractor, Aramark.
5. Parking in loading dock and service drives and the Baltimore Convention Center Employee's parking area, except for loading and unloading, is prohibited. Violators will be towed at their own expense and risk.
6. All freight and exhibit material must enter the facility through designated loading docks.

In no case should passenger elevators, escalators, or public lobbies be used for this purpose.

7. All fire, safety, and building regulations must be strictly followed. Particular attention should be paid to the prohibition against propane, acetylene and other flammable materials.
